Westminster Confession of Faith, 25: 1 & 2

The catholic or universal church, which is invisible, consists of the whole number of the elect, that have been, are, or shall be gathered into one, under Christ the head thereof; and is the spouse, the body, the fulness of him that fills all in all.

REFLECTION

Many Covenants, One Promise

Are God's various covenants a succession of separate, unrelated covenants? Does he end one covenant and then replace it with a new one? Or, do the covenants build on one another, unfolding God's redemptive plan, little by little, until his whole purpose is revealed? In other words, has God had one single plan of redemption for all his people in all times, or has he had multiple plans that address different people in different times?

The covenantal view sees one unified plan of redemption that embraces every area of life....

There is but one covenant of grace—one conditional promise of redemption—that runs throughout all Scripture and redemptive history. Within this one covenant of grace there are a variety of administrations. These various administrations are seen in the Adamic covenant, the Noahic covenant, the Abrahamic covenant, the Mosaic covenant, the Davidic covenant, and the New Covenant....

God's one plan of redemption unfolded in time to reveal more of his purpose as he entered into covenant with David. This new administration of the covenant of grace is described in 2 Samuel 7, which relates how God inaugurated and established his kingdom. The kingship of David prefigured the ever-lasting kingship of David's descendant—King Jesus.

The unique feature of the Davidic covenant was the establishment of a king over Israel forever. The Lord spoke to David through Nathan, saying, When your days are over and you rest with your fathers, I will raise up your offspring to succeed you, who will come from your own body, and I will establish his kingdom. He is the one who will build a house for my Name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. (vv. 12-13). This prophecy was fulfilled both in Solomon and eventually in Jesus Christ. King David never hesitated to appeal to the previous covenant oaths of God and to apply them to his kingdom. The Davidic covenant specifically identified itself with both the Abrahamic and the Mosaic covenants. For example, David recalled the promises that God had made to Abraham when he sang about the ark being brought to Jerusalem....

We should also note that mere physical descent from David was not sufficient reason for a descendant to receive covenant blessings. God required, as he always had, covenant faithfulness from the heart. Then, and only then, could covenant blessing be expected and the redemptive promises be fulfilled.

In the Old Testament covenants, the flower bud of redemption swells in anticipation of a full display of all its glory and beauty. As God reveals more and more of his redemptive plan, new revelation is always inseparably tied to his previous covenants. In fact, each successive covenant is but a renewal and an explanation of the previous covenants.
